I feel a little better now. lol I looked around on-line and found a lot of info about new windows having the same problem.</p> <p>They have 4 windows in this room. 2 have been restored and two are going to be taken on Monday for the same work. This got me a little nervous because it's the first time I've ever noticed water pouring off the sashes the first day in.</p> <p>I think the 2 left to do didn't get condensation because they have air leaks that keep the inside of the glass cool and don't allow the hot air to ever get close enough to the glass to condensate.</p> <p>Should be interesting to see what happens when the other 2 are tightened up. The other thought I had was that the kitchen is just off this room. An obvious source of moisture on a daily basis. I need to ask if they have or use the exhaust fans. With the loss of air leaks, they need to consider to moisture they produce and alternative ways to remove it from the house.</p> <p>I love this stuff, this is building science! :)</p> <hr/> <p>Jason Whipple</p>

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
